- 1. CHRISTIANITY DEVELOPED A NEW SPIRIT OF BENEFICENCE IN THE PEOPLE. Acts 11:29. The benefience was:

 - 1. INDIVIDUAL
 1. "EVERY MAN." There was not one who did not contribute something.
 - (1) The new leve they had glowed in every heart, .. Not just a few.
 - (2) The new love they had found expression in the gift of every hand.
 - 2. PROPORTIONATE "Every man according to his ability! 1. False standard among men:
 - (1) It was not according to what some one else did. (2) It was not according to what other people
 - expected. (3) They did not measure themselves by them-
 - selves. 2 Cor. 10:12 (4) Their giving at that time was in keeping
 - with what Paul said about fifteen years after this time. 2 Cor. 9:7 no preaching so eloquent as that
 - 3. IT WAS PROMPT "Then the brethren determined to send relief." which Dounds out 1. Had they been characterized by the selfishness
 - of our present day they would have said: (1) Let us see first how severe the famine (it was to come over the entire world) is going to be with us? Our neighbors.
 - (2) If we see that we have anyting to spare we will send it to our more distant brethren
 - from whale hearted benevalence 4. IT WAS JUDICIOUS. They arranged for its distribution
 - "Sent it to the hands of elders." 1. They were not merely willing to share their good with their impowerished brehtren at Judea.
 - 2. They were willing to share their salvation with all who would accept it.
 - 3. Their hands reached across the seas to bring others, Gentiles a s well as Jews, to the One whose name they would henceforth bear. So it should be today.
