- 1. The nature and duty of mortification. What it means to mortify your members. next undnesday wight 1. ITS NATURE: Cel 3:9-14- Pert an the new man -
  - (1) It means to resist the solicitation of sin.
  - (2) Mortification implies a lingering process. Though not in power the old life lingers on ... reaching out for aenewilease on life.
  - (3) MORTIFY implies that sin will not die of its self. We must slay ... kill it.
  - (4) Jesus' law of mortification. Matt. 5:29,30
  - 2. The duty of mortification
    - (1) It is commanded. We are to show no more mercy to the "old man" than to the " "right eye" or the "right hand" that offends us. Matt. 5:29,30
    - (2) This mortification is done in the power of the Spirit. Romans 8:13
- 2. The ground of the condemnation.
  - 1. That these members are upon the earth is not the ground of condemnation...but that they are used to hold correspondence with the earth.
  - 2. Paul tells us to present our entire bodies a living sacrifice. Komans 12:1
- 3. Two things enjoined.
  - 1. Death to corrupt living.
    - (1) The gulf between Christianity and the world is too wide and deep to be bridged by flimsy come promisies.
    - (2) Impossible for a man to walk firmly with one foot in the gutter and the other on the curb.
    - (3) Two classes of sin:
      - (1) Impurity of life...Covetousness which is idolatry ... Greed of gain; Miser's worship.
    - 2. Death to wrong conversation ... language.
      - (1) ANGER: hot displeasure ... a desire to punish.
        - (2) Wrath: Vituperative outburst ... to abuse in words. Violent anger. Naaman ... 2 Kings 5:11,12

      - (3) MALICE: Malice aforethought. Deliberate ill-will
        (4) Blasphemy: Taking God's name...Irreverence.
        (5) FILTHY COMMUNICATION: Foul-mouthed abuse. Railing shameful speaking.
