- 1. COUNCIL CONCERNING OFFENCES. Luke 17:1,2 1. Offences are sure to come.
- 2. The source and offences would be worldliness, selfishness, on the part of professors of godliness. EXAMPLE: The rich man of Luke 16:19-31 who, no doubt, was religious but was heartless, selfish, condemned for inhumanity.
- 2. COUNCIL CONCERNING FORGIVENESS. Luke 17:3,4

  Mattatl8:21;22;2Rom. 12:21

  1. Here Jesus tells the future teachers in
- his Church how they must act. 1. They must never grow tired of exercising forgiveness. AND: 2. Without modifying the unfavorable opin-
- ion we have formed of his conduct. 3. COUNCIL CONCERNING FAITH. Luke 17:5,6 Matt. 17:14-21
  - 1. Increase our faith. If they had the least amount of faith, whihe Jesus compares to a mustard seed, they would have power to: 1. Accomplish what seemed to them impossible. 2. With that amount of faith they could
  - win the victory everthemselves necessary for a perpetual loving judgment of others.
- 4. COUNCIL CONCERNING SERVICE. Luke 17:7-10
- 1. The servants duties: Plowing and feeding of the cattle.
  - 2. For the loyal, patient, unwearied worker, there can be no complacency, self-satisfaction, hither to will I serve and no more. No asking, "What shall we have therefore." Matt. 19:27
