- 2. Mr. Kirk says that it cannot and gives the following reason:
  - Because of our conception of Christianity today.
     We view it as amounting to little more than a vague spirit of friendliness. BE FRIENDLY.
  - 2. Our conception of Christianity today is based upon some SMALL measure of financial support, and occasional attendance provided:

    1. The church demand no real sacrifice. Rom.12:1
    - 2. The church preaches no exacting doctrine.
      (1) Everything in general and nothing in particular contains and nothing in
      - (1) Everything in general and nothing in particular idea.
  - 3. Protestantism (Christianity) is going to fail because:
    - 1. Conditions in modern America do not encourage the search for God. The good things of life appear to come automatically. For all things man seems to look:
      - (1) To the big factories and department stores
      - (2) To the state-federal government.
      - (3) To the corporation & giant union for protection. NOT TO GOD. Jones 1:17
  - 4. Protestantism is going to fail becuase:
    - 1. Man seems to tolerate God rather than to fear him. "Yes I believe in God but I am not nuts about him," answered on co-ed.

## A VAST DIFFERENCE IN PROTESTANTISM AND REAL CHRISTIANITY

- 1. Christianity has been sorely tried in every age and has withstood every test. IT WAS TESTED:
  - 1. By the death of John the Baptist. Matt. 14:1-11; mush 6:14-15.
    2. By the death of Jesus: the Founder of Christianity
  - 3. By the death of Stephen, the first Christian marty
    2. It is tested today by internal strife and irregularities: 1.Judas the traitor; 2.Peter denied Jesus.

2. Ananias and Sapphira lied about their ability to give.

- 3. CHRISTIANITY IS TESTED AND TRIED IN OUR DAY: 1. By indifference on the part of many.
- 4. The church has had problems in every age. 1. Up to this time at least, the problem of the church
  - has been "HOW CAN IT SAVE THE WORLD?"
  - 2. Today, a new problem may be confronting the church and expressed in this question: "How can the church save itself from the world?"
