JUDE 14-16 LESSON AUDITORIUM CLASS JOHNSON CITY SUNDAY MORNING AUGUST 2, 1976

INTRODUCTION: In the preceding section, Jude 11-13, we have a vivid picture of the moral corruption of ungodly seducers: Apostate teachers. These apostate teachers are described as follows:

- 1. "Spots in your feasts of charity (love), when they fleast with you, feeding themselves without fear..." Verse 12
 - 1. Their evil example and wrong teaching led others into unchristian courses to their own destruction.
- 2. Their Emptiness and Instability.
 - 1. "Clouds they are without water, carried about of winds." Verse 12
 - 1. They promised much but delivered nothing.
 - 2. They professed to have something to give but they could not give what they had not,
- 3. Their Inability to Deliver. "Clouds they are without water, carried about of winds." Verse 12
 - 1. They were unstable in doctrine, carried about by every intellectual pronouncement.
 - 2. James 1:8; "Adouble minded man is unstable in all his ways."
- 4. Their Utter Unfruitfulness. "Trees whose fruit witherith, wihtout fruit, tiwce dead, plucked up by the roots.V-12

1. They arellike autumn trees, which aught to be full of fruit but they are not.

- 2. They are like the barren fig tree: appeared to be alive; promise to deliver fruit but do not deliver. Matt. 21:18-21; Mark 11:12-14
- 3. There was not fruit because there was no life. John 15:8
- 5. Their shameless and turbulent temper. "Wild waves of the sea foaming out their own shame. Verse 13 1. Isaiah 57:20; "But the wicked are like the troubled sea, when it cannot rest, whose waters cast up mire and dirt."
- Misleading guides and their future destiny.
 "Wandering stars, to whom is reserved the balckness of darkness forever." Verse 13

JUDE 14-16. Sunday morning August 2, 1976. Auditorium class in Johnson City.

- 1. The Prophecy Of Enoch. Jude 14-16
 1. An ancient prophecy of judgment against the wicked by Enoch.
 - 1. "And Enoch also, the seventh from Adam, prophesied of these saying..." Verse 14
 - 2. Who Enoch was:
 - 1. He was a preeminently holy man, who was translated to heaven without dying. (Gen. 5:21-23; Heb. 11:5)
 - 2. No doubt Enoch called "the seventh from Adam" to distinguish him from Enoch the son of Cain. Gen. (Jude 14; Gen. 4:17)
 - 3. Adam, Seth, Enos, Cainan, Mahaleel, Jared, Enoch, Methuselah, Lamech, and Noah.
- 2. What Enoch Prophesied. Verses 14, 15, Jude 1. "The Lord cometh with ten thousand of his saints."
 - 1. His coming will be in the end of the world the time unknown to man. Matt. 24:36, 42; 25:13. 2 Thess. 1:6-9
 - 2. He "will come to execu te judgment upon all, and to convince (convict) all the ungodly..."
 - 1. They will answer for all their ungodly deed which they have ungodly committed.
 - 2. All of their hard speeches which ungodly sinners have spoken against him.
- 3. What these people are.
 - 1. These are murmurers, complainers, walking after their own lusts. Verse 16
 - 1. The murmurer counts God a hard master and himself a good servant.
 - 2. What murmurers should learn:
 - 1. Murmuring cannot or benefit them.
 - 2. Murmuring fills their lives with still deeper anxiety and unrest.
 - . 3.3. That wars and fightings of life come of the lusts of men. James 4:1, 2
 - 2. These people were given to vain boasting. V-16
 - 1. They speak great swelling words.
 - 2. Having men's persons in admiration because of advantage. Lev. 19:15; "... Thou shalt not respect the person of the poor, nor honor the person of the mighty. Also James 2:1-4

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
