1. It is not enough to have compassion for a great

- affliction. 1. Love will search for remedies. 2. "I brought him to thyydisciples, and they could not cure
- him." Matt. 17:16; Mark 9:18; Luke 9:40. 1. Did the disciples have power to work miracles? They dids (1) They had been sent forth. Matt. 10:8
- (2) They came back and reported. Luke 10:17 2. WHY DID THEY FAIL?
- (1) Because of your unbelief. Matt. 17:20 (2) Because of self-centeredness. "Why could not WE
- cast him out?" A. Not a question of WE but the Lord.

(3) May have been to confident of their own powers.

A. We always fail when we trust in our own selves

- 3. Want of spirituality is caused by want of faith. It is unnatural to be without faith for:
 - 1. It is the pulse of the world. EXAMPLE: Conditions of the world today are caused by the absence of faith. 2. Without faith we are weak and not able to move a step
- 3. There is not one thing we can't ake for granted. 4.LESSONS TO LEARN:

beyond the bound of actual knowledge.

- 1. Affliction is not an unmixed evil. It may be the means of a great blessing. In this case affliction led to two great mercies:

 - It led the boy himself to Christ.
 It led the father to Christ.
 - 2. The Christian is the representative of Christ.
 - (1) His failure may be falsely charged as the failure of Christianity. 3. This man was not blinded to Christ by the failure of his disciples.
 - (1) We must learn to turn from Christ's imperfect followers to Christ himself. (2) If not pleased with the verdict we may go to the highest court.

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
