## 1. THE MEASURE OF HONOR DUE TO THE ELDERS. Verses 17,18

- 1. Two classes here referred to: 1. The passage suggest that all elders worked ...
  - 2. But all did not labor in word and doctrine.
- 2. Honor Due to Them:
  - 1. All were to be given double honor.
    - 2. Especially those who labor in word and doctrine.
- 3. The grounds for this injunction.
  - 1. Thou shalt not muzzle the ox that treadeth out the corn. Deut. 25:4
    - 2. The labourer is worthy of his hire. 1 Cor. 9:14

## 2. HOW TO DEAL WITH ACCUSATIONS AGAINST EIDERS. Verse 19

- 1. Why elders might be exposed to accusations.
  - 1. The weakness of the flesh of man.
  - 2. Because of their duty to convince the gainsayers. 3. Because of their duty to reprove those at fault.
- 2. The course recommended in this case:
  - 1. The Accusation established in the mouth of two or three witnesses. 2. Consider who these witnesses are.
  - 3. It was the duty of Timothy to make an investigation which must be supported by adequate evidence
  - 4. There is nothing in a minister's life or the life of the elder that would exempt them from a just inquiry and its due consequences.

## 3. THE MANNER AND HOW OF PUBLIC REBUKE. Verse 20

- 1. The how of the rebuke. Gal. 6:1
  - 1. In the spirit of meekness...not compromise.
  - 2. Rebuke before all...not in a corner, secretely.
  - 3. That others also may fear.
- 4. DOING NOTHING BY PARTIALITY. Verses 21, 22
  - 1. Referring to the judicial inquiries respecting elders and other members of the church.
- 1. The absence of prejudging, prejudice, partiality. 5. REGARDING TIMOTHY'S HEALTH. Verse 23
  - 1. Wine for thy stomach's sake ... frequent ailments.
