Psalms 27:11 1. In this verse the Psalmist asks for a double safe guard:

- 1. Divine guidance. 2. A Plain Path.
- 2. If sure of Divine guidance, why ask for the other? Answer:
 - A great part of God's leading consists only in making the path plain.
 Because danger and temptation beset even
 - Because danger and temptation beset even the plainest path, and David said, "Because of mine enemies."
 - 1. In the path God is able to keep us from falling; Jude 24;

"Now unto him that is able to keep you from falling, and to present you faultless before the presence of his glory with exceeding joy..."

- 3. This prayer is a prayer against three dangers:
 - 1. The danger of choosing our own way.

 Proverbs 14:12; Proverbs 16:2; 21:2/
 - 2. Trusting, even in the plainest way, to our own strength and wisdom. Proverbs 3:5 6; "Trust in the L rd with all thine heart; and lean not unto thine own understanding: 6-In all thy ways acknowledge him, and he shall direct thy paths." Jeremiah 10:23.

3. Danger of distrusting God's leadings.
1. Deut. 31:6; Isaiah 43:2.
