- 1. TO BECOME LIKE CHRIST: Two things necessary:
  - (1) We must become like Christ in Character.

- 2. Why SOME FAIL TO BECOME LIKE CHRIST:
  - (1) Their business is such that they cannot put Christ into it.
  - (2) They cannot take Christ into their social rela-
  - (3) They make no effort to acquire the same consecration and humility they love to note in Jesus.
  - (4) Some are piously humble on the Lord's Day, but follow the ways of the world during the week.

## LET THE MIND OF CHRIST BE IN YOU: CHRIST OUR EXAMPLE;

- 1. The outward life of Christ.
  - (1) He pleased not himself. (2) He did not seek out the high places.
  - (3) He did not choose a life of ease, comfort, pleasure
  - (4) He lived for others; he went about doing good.
  - (5) He cared for the souls of the lost regardless.
  - (6) He tasted the depth of human weakness, that he

might be "touched with the feeling of our informities. Heb.4:15,16
