1. Earthly treasure: Eartlhy and exposed to destruction 2. Heavenly treasure: Including all worldly possessions,

2. He avenly treasure: Contains all of our spiritual accomplishments. These are beyond the reach of any earthly con-

tingencey.

2. WHAT MEN THINK OF THESE TWO TREASURES.

1. The earthly treasure:

1. Men have ever felt a greater interest in the EARTHLY than the HEAVENLY.

2. With few exceptions WORLDLY WEalth has been, and still is the SUMMUM BONUM fo the race.

3. The most sacred right of humanity, Time, Intellect Justice, Truth, Conscience, are bartered for this EARTHLY TREASURE.

4. "WHAT WILL YE GIVE ME?" has ever been the popular query; and, Judas like many will sedl the most sacred thing for "silver."

2. The heavenly treasure:

1. Includes all spiritual excellences. Includes all that enriches man in his immeasurable and permanent SPIRITUAL relations with God.

3. POINTS OF RESEMBLANCE SUBSISTING BETWEEN THESE TWO TREASURES.

1. Both are capable of accumulation. "Lav Up."

2. Both may be attractive to the heart. "Where your treasure is, there will your heart be also." V.21

3. Both may be dominant forces. "No man can serve two masters."

1. Love worldly weath most ... Mamon our master.

2. Love obedience, moral goodness most. GOD IS MASTER
